The minutes of the Council meeting are an overview of business conducted and are not the official minutes of the meeting. The official minutes will be available at the Clerk's office after they are approved by the Mayor and Council at the April council meeting.

The monthly meeting of the Sharpsburg Mayor and Council was an informal meeting, as there were not enough councilmembers present for a quorum to hold an "official" meeting.

Mayor Spielman began the session at 7:03pm with Public Comments. Rick Canfield of Sharpsburg, asked about the postings on Facebook about a gas station, such as AC&T or a Sheetz coming to town. The Mayor stated that that is an ugly rumor. No one has approached the town, or asked questions of the town to see if this could even be a possibility. The properties in question are located in a "Town Residential" zone, so that would be red tape to go through, as well as red tape to get through the Ordinances of the town. The public was assured that if something like this were to come about, that the townspeople would be notified via the newspaper, Town Crier, the website, postings, etc. to let them know.

Dwayne Harris of Sharpsburg, presented a drawing to the Mayor and Council, which mapped out how the Come All Who Are Thirsty Veterans Group would organize space at the Mark A. Smith Park to have garden space. The areas would be maintained by Veterans, as part of their therapy, and the items would be sold at the Victory Garden Ranch, with the profits going back to the Come All Who Are Thirsty Organization.

Clay Herzog of Sharpsburg, was concerned about the log that appears to be lodged in the wires of Verizon on North Mechanic Street. The Mayor stated that the Town has called Verizon about this before, and that we would put another call into them and get it taken care of ASAP.

#### **Committee Reports**

Parks and Railroad Station: Brandon was not present for a report

**Building:** Michael stated that he would get the lettering completed on Town Hall ASAP **Streets:** Tamara was not present to give a report, but Darryl let Kimberly know that there are only two areas in the alleys that he felt the Fire Truck would not be able to get through. He stated that it is nothing major, and our mowing contractor should be able to handle it, or the inmates if we get them back soon.

**Planning & Zoning:** Russ stated that there will be a meeting for the Planning Commission on Wednesday April 12<sup>th</sup> at 7pm at Town Hall. Meetings are open to the public

Battlefield Advisory Committee: Perry Jamieson stated that Chris Vincent has joined the committee. The committee will meet Wednesday and Mr. Jamieson will get the notes to Kimberly for the Crier Public Safety: Darryl was unable to attend, however; the Mayor, Vice Mayor and Councilpersons that are able, will have a meeting with the Boonsboro Police Department on Tuesday at 10am to discuss getting an officer for Sharpsburg. It was also discussed that people are running the stop sign at W Antietam and S Hull Streets. We will see if a deputy can pay attention to this area and Kimberly will also see if the Little League could send out a blanket email, reminding their parents to slow down and obey the traffic signs.

**Town Archives & Historical Planning:** Ed reported that he has begun archiving items.

Mayor's Report: Mayor Spielman reminded the Council of the gala to benefit Tolson's Chapel on Saturday. The Town purchased a table, and if you would like to go, let Kimberly know. Mayor Spielman also mentioned that he would like to attend the MML Convention again this year and he would like the Council to discuss paying for the convention registration fees again this year. Russ stated that since he is not a paid Mayor, that his travel expenses should also be discussed. This will be discussed at the May meeting when a quorum is present.

Parade day is full of hustle and bustle. Please take note of the following road closures, so that you may plan your day accordingly:

From 11:00am-11:45am, Main Street from the intersection of Rt 34 and Rt 65 to the intersection of Rt 34 and Hall Streets will be closed. During this time, Antietam and Chapline Streets will be open for travel.

From 1:30pm-3:00pm, Rt 34 (Main Street) will be closed, so please plan your travel to and from Sharpsburg accordingly. There will be no cutting through the parade allowed, due to safety concerns.

#### A reminder from the Tax Collector



If you have not paid your fiscal year 2017 taxes, that were billed in July, 2016, they must be paid as soon as possible. Final invoices were mailed to those individuals April 10th.

Taxes that have not been paid by May 5, 2017 will be forwarded to the County Treasurer, and will be at risk to be sold at tax sale.

### **Brush Pickup**



Brush pickup will be held Monday May 8<sup>th</sup>. Brush, as defined by the company performing the pickup, is "woody material 4" in diameter, or smaller." Yard waste, garden waste and anything with a root ball will not be collected.

Brush should be placed in the alleys at the end of your property, clearly visible from the alley. Do not place brush behind buildings or fences, as the company will not go onto your property to collect it.

All brush must be placed along the alleys prior to May 8<sup>th</sup>, as the company will not return due to brush not being out in time.

If you could place your brush all going in the same direction, that would make the job easier on the company collecting the pile.

#### **Battlefield Advisory Committee**



The committee met on Wednesday April 5<sup>th</sup>.

The committee welcomed three new members: Robert Murphy, Christopher Vincent and Michael Wasiljov. For their benefit Superintendent Trail reviewed the history and purposes of the committee. She also explained how the Antietam Battlefield is organized and listed its divisions and their chiefs.

The Burnside Bridge renovation project was completed a few days before Christmas. The holidays and the weather made that a bad time for the ceremony. The Burnside Bridge will be rededicated on Friday April 21 at 1pm.

In November 2016 Antietam Battlefield held an open house on its Visitor Access and Circulation Plan, a study that takes into account changes since the 1990's and considers how the experience of today's visitors could be improved. The battlefield staff gained ideas that night from roughly forty citizens who attended the open house and later suggestions made electronically and other ways. Using these recommendations, the staff now is developing plans to rehabilitate the Visitor's Center; add and relocate tour stops; and make changes in the current trail system. The next open house will be held in the late spring or early summer.
