The minutes of the Council meeting are an overview of business conducted and are not the official minutes of the meeting. The official minutes will be available at the Clerk's office after they are approved by the Mayor and Council at next month's council meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by Mayor Hal Spielman.

The minutes of the December 2017 meeting were moved for approval by Darryl and seconded by Ed. The motion carried.

The December 2017 treasurer's report was approved as presented.

The January 2018 treasurer's report was approved as presented.

Public Comment:

Meredith Poffenberger invited the Council and the public to attend meetings of the Sharpsburg Merchant's and Community Association; a unifying and economic development group. The next meeting will be held Tuesday February 20, 2018 at 11:30am in the side room of Bender's Tavern. She stated that the purpose of the group is to bring unity to Sharpsburg and possibly more businesses and foot traffic to the town.

Mayor Spielman thanked Meredith Poffenberger, owner of the Marketplace of Sharpsburg, for the gift of a print titled "Town Square" that the Marketplace gave to the Town.

Ernie Wetterer inquired as to when the Town Deputy would start. Mayor Spielman informed him that this would not take place until late May/early June.

Kelly Moore of Sharpsburg stated that he attended Meredith's meeting and that it was very informative and encouraged everyone to attend.

Larry Ceren and Heather Barnes of Shepherd's Spring, a local facility just outside of Town, introduced themselves and encouraged everyone to check out their programs that they offer including a summer camp, global heifer village, hikes, classes and more. Although they are affiliated with the Church of the Brethren, not all of their programs are religion based.

Jeff Prenger of West Main Street thanked the Sharpsburg Fire Company for their quick response to GeGe's Place, which unfortunately burnt in the early morning hours.

A resident voiced concern over issues that are occurring at a local business and is questioning what more can be done. He was encouraged to continue contacting the police when a particular issue is occurring. If the Town Clerk calls, that is listed as one occurrence to the police. However; if numerous people call with complaints, each of those will register individually. The Mayor and Council will plan a meeting with the owners of the property and the business.

It was also suggested that once the Deputy comes on board and attends meetings, that this will be advertised to the public, so that citizens can attend to voice their concerns with the deputy.

Committee Reports

Parks and Railroad Station: Brandon stated that the new aerator would be installed when the pond is not frozen. Mayor Spielman asked the Council about the possibility of locking the park for the winter months. It was decided, after discussion and input from the public, not to close the park.

Building: Michael asked if the Council would want the same type of cabinet out front to post information; one that lights or does not light. He also suggested a projection mechanism out front which would place the information out as well. Tamara asked if that would fit into the looks and feel of the Town. Michael stated that he would gain pricing on all avenues and would send a link to the Council, so that they can see exactly what product he is suggesting.

Streets: Nothing to report

Battlefield Advisory Committee: Mr. Vincent stated that the next meeting will be in April.

Public Safety: Darryl stated that the EMS should be in their new building in a week or two

Town Archives and Historical Planning: Ed stated that there will be a Founder's Day meeting on Thursday February 8th at 7pm. He also stated that we are getting in donations for the museum

Mayor's Report: Mayor Spielman received a letter from the Friends of Tolson's Chapel in regards to a \$25 membership. Tamara moved to purchase a membership and Darryl seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Old Business

Approval of Little League Contract: Darryl moved to approve the Little League contract as amended at the workshop meeting and Ed seconded the motion. The motion carried.

New Business

Cameras: Darryl spoke with a representative that installed our cameras. They stated that we have the ability to add three additional cameras to our system. It was suggested to place two out front and one in the library. Pricing will be available in the next few weeks.

Renewal of Mowing Contract: The mowing contract is up in March. There is the option to renew the contract for two additional years. Since Shepherdstown Lawns has been doing an exceptional job, Darryl moved to renew the contract for the two year period and Brandon seconded the motion. The motion carried. Kimberly will send a letter to the owner of Shepherdstown Lawns, informing him that the Town would like to renew for two years.

Renewal of Waste Collection Contract: We received a letter from the Vice President of Apple Valley Waste, wishing to renew the waste collection contract under the original terms for a one year period.

Tamara moved to renew the contract for one year and Ed seconded the motion. The motion carried. Kimberly will send a letter stating that we wish to accept their renewal for a one year period; beginning May 1, 2018 and ending April 30, 2019.

It was asked when the speed camera at the school would be arriving. Kimberly will contact Sheriff Mullendore for further information on this.

Ed moved to adjourn the meeting at 7:54pm and Tamara seconded the motion. The motion carried.


