### **Battlefield Advisory Committee**

The committee met on Wednesday, January 3, 2018.

Superintendent Trail opened the meeting by wishing everyone a Happy New Year and recapping some end of year events and projects. The Memorial Illumination was very successful, the nice weather and full moon rising at the start of the event made it even more memorable. More than 1,300 vehicles proceeded through the route into the early morning hours. Next year marks the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Memorial Illumination, with plans to expand into some new areas of the battlefield.

The Antietam National Cemetery walkway project is nearing completion. The new walkway restores the historic walkway that was once in the National Cemetery and will make visiting more accessible for all. The walkway extends from the brick pavers at the entrance, to and around the Private Soldier Monument in the center of the cemetery. The walk is eight feet wide along the center aisle way and six feet wide around the monument. The concrete surface is very close to the appearance of what the original loose gravel surface looked like. New sod and grass seed will be planted to even out the surface.

At the end of December a contract was awarded for the Burnside Bridge Walkway. This project will restore the walkway and the retaining walls from the McKinley Monument down to the bridge. The project will begin in the spring and last throughout the summer into fall. During construction a temporary path will be made along the roadway to allow visitors access to the bridge from the overlook parking area.
