The minutes of the town meeting are not the official minutes; they are an overview of the business conducted. A copy of the official minutes can be obtained at the town office from the clerk.

The monthly meeting of the Sharpsburg Mayor and Council was held at the Antietam Train Station on Monday, July 7th. Mayor Spielman called the meeting to order at 7:30pm.

The June minutes and the June Treasurer's report were both approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Parks and Railroad Station- The railroad station is in need of a new roof. This must be kept within the standards of the Maryland Historic Preservation. The group at the train station has been in contact with local contractors to obtain pricing.

The aerator at the pond seems to be blocked; this will be checked and repaired.

Building – We are obtaining estimates for the trim of Town Hall to be painted. Most companies that have been contacted state they are too busy. One company did come out to take a look at the building and we are awaiting their estimate. Brandon stated he would also try to get some estimates.

Streets – It was moved to have Frederick Seibert go ahead with the engineering portion of the East Chapline Street Extended project. We will also contact the County in regards to issues with runoff from the townhomes that were built on county property on East Chapline Street, to see if they will be willing to help with the Chapline Street project.

Planning and Zoning – We are still awaiting the Comprehensive Plan's return from the state with their comments. We have several interested persons to serve on the Board of Zoning Appeals and the Planning Commission. These individuals will be contacted in regards to training that they need to complete.

Battlefield Advisory Committee – This meeting will take place on Wednesday, July 9th. Mr. Jamieson will get Kimberly the information for the Crier.

Mayor's Report – We have a citizen that is bringing out of town trash into the town for pick up. This will not be tolerated and the citizen will be charged each time they continue to do this, including any additional cost or fees that the town incurs when we need to ask the trash company to return to pick up the trash.

Old Business

- 1. Grants for old Legion building Russ has been unsuccessful in reaching Steve Goodrich for assistance in this process. He will call some of the County Commissioners to see if they are able to help out with reaching Mr. Goodrich, or another individual that may be able to help.
- 2. Budget The budget for Fiscal Year 2015 was moved for approval. The motion passed.
- 3. Miss Virginia's Headstone Fund It was decided that we would close the donation period on July 31st and at that time present the monies to the Friends of Tolson's Chapel so that they may select a marker that they feel is appropriate for Miss Virginia and the Cemetery.

New Business

- 1. Flag Removal Will plan to take down the flags on Main Street on July 9th, as long as the weather cooperates.
- 2. September's Meeting The first Monday in September is Labor Day, so September's meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 2, 2014 at 7:30pm at Town Hall
- **3.** Zoning Administrator Hours Zoning Administrator Howard Long will have hours at Town Hall on Tuesdays from 10am-6pm, with additional hours available by appointment.
- **4.** Trimming of alleys Members of the council will begin to work on trimming of the alleys when their schedules permit.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:15pm. The next meeting will be held Monday, August 4th at 7:30pm at Town Hall.

We appreciated the hospitality of the members of Antietam Station. After the meeting concluded, we received a tour of the station and were able to see the trains in action.

Mr. Saylor worked in the Washington County Public School system as an IA, which is where he picked up the name "Mr. Jeff." Many of the residents and people that interacted with him during his time at Sharpsburg Elementary still call him that. He worked at Kretzer's Market for Cy and Missy Kretzer for 22 years until its closing. He served on the town council as a councilman and as Vice Mayor for many years. Mr. Jeff works at the Boonsboro Pharmacy delivering supplies and medicines and I'm sure a friendly smile, to those that are unable to get out and pick them up themselves. Mr. Jeff was diagnosed with liver cancer in the spring. His journey with this terrible disease has not been an easy one, for him or his wife Karen and daughter, Emily. He is in the process of traveling to and from Johns Hopkins Hospital for treatments and chemotherapy.

Mr. Jeff has spent his life helping and serving others and now he is in need of our help.

As with most medical treatments, insurance only covers so much. Mr. Jeff's church, the Sharpsburg Bible Church, has opened a fund at Jefferson Security Bank to assist with his medical bills.
