The meeting of the Sharpsburg Mayor and Council was called to order at 7:00 pm by Mayor Hal Spielman. The February minutes and the February Treasurer's report were both approved as presented.

Public Comment

Deputy Peyton was present to state that the speed trailer that was requested is not being deployed until the spring time. At that time he hopes to bring it to town.

Groundbreaking/Work Day at Mark A. Smith Memorial Park



Join Come All Who are Thirsty Veterans Group (CAWAT) on Sunday, April 28th from 1 pm – 3 pm, in Day 1 of creating the Mark A. Smith Memorial Park in Sharpsburg. The Town of Sharpsburg has donated this piece of land to honor modern-era Veterans; from the Cold War, Persian Gulf, Panama, and Grenada, to Iraq, Africa and Afghanistan. Also featured in the memorial will be a representation of Veterans of ALL eras in a silent dog tag memorial at the completion of this project. Thanks to local Veterans Mike Fasulo, Josh Roll and Ernie Wetterer in donating the first sets of tags, which they wore in their time of service.

The name of the park will remain Mark A. Smith, in honor of the young boy who lost his life many years ago in the nearby creek.

Battlefield Advisory Committee



The committee met on Wednesday, February 13, 2019.

Due to the partial federal government shutdown, the January meeting was canceled and rescheduled for February. Superintendent Trail discussed how the shutdown affected the park. Access was maintained to the park as much as possible during the five weeks. The Observation Tour and nightly gates were closed throughout the shutdown, as was the Visitor Center and Museum Bookstore. Law Enforcement Rangers remained on duty and two maintenance staff personnel were working as needed.

Superintendent Trail also talked about the recent news of the non-binding agreement by Gov. Larry Hogan with the U.S. Department of the Interior. This agreement would be an exchange of 2,481 acres in South Mountain State Battlefield for 512 acres at Oxon Cove National Park in Prince George's County, where a stadium for the Washington Redskins is proposed to be built. Superintendent Trail stated that there are no new developments of an exchange.

The project design for the rehabilitation of the Antietam Visitor's Center is awaiting approval. The project is expected to start by the summer of 2020 and be completed by 2022. The Observation Tower rehabilitation project will begin soon. The project includes replacing stairs, repointing the stonework, and adding additional railings for safety in the viewing area of the tower.

The McKinley walkway project will be completed with the installation of handrails along the route to the Burnside Bridge. The historic 6-rail fence along the Hagerstown Pike has started and the painting of the barns at the Mumma and Newcomer farms. The Mumma house will also be painted this year.

The next meeting is scheduled for April 10, 2019.

As the banner was presented, they were told how honored and humbled we were to present it to them and to know that every time our heads are bowed in prayer, their children will be included, as with all our military.


