The meeting of the Sharpsburg Mayor and Council was called to order at 7pm by Mayor Hal Spielman. The July and August treasurer's reports and the August minutes were all approved as read.

There were no public comments.

#### **Committee Reports**

**Parks & Railroad Station:** Order a ½ load of mulch for the park area. The October meeting will be held at the Railroad Station.

**Building:** It was moved to have Smith Renovations complete the chair rail project in the Council chambers.

**Streets:** Still awaiting drawings from Frederick Seibert & Associates for the E Chapline Street project. Kimberly will call Keith and see where he is with those drawings. Members of the Council met with the County Commissioners explaining their concern of the speed in town. The County Commissioners are willing to help figure out a solution. Kimberly will write a follow up letter to them thanking them for having their meeting in Sharpsburg and asking for follow up on the items discussed.

**Public Safety:** Officer Cain retired in June and there is now no specific deputy assigned to Sharpsburg. This concern was addressed with the Sheriff's Department.
