
She calls this a "perfect retirement job", peaceful, casual, low stress, and she can pick her hours. She especially enjoys working with the town residents and the Mayor and Council.

Embedded Civil War Timeline Block



September 14 Struggle for Freedom

The Battle of Antietam, fought amongst the hills surrounding Sharpsburg, Maryland on September 17, 1862, provided President Abraham Lincoln with the victory he needed to issue the Preliminary Emancipation Proclamation. What had led Lincoln to that moment? Perhaps more important - what did the issuing of the Proclamation achieve? This talk will look at the events leading up to the Emancipation, the short and long-term effects of the document, and place the Emancipation into the greater American story - the long struggle for freedom.

Jess Rowley was born and raised in Arizona. After serving in the Marine Corps Reserves from 2003 to 2009, he graduated from the University of Northern Colorado with a B.A. in History in 2011. He began his NPS career in 2012 at Zion National Park, in southern Utah, before moving to Antietam with his wife and three children in 2015. Jess has now worked at Antietam for over eight years in the Interpretive Division.
